

On January 31st, the THPO Crew along with Gov. Armijo traveled to Santa Fe to visit the Ralph T. Coe Center for the Arts. During THPO's last visit, we were able to review their diverse collection of Indigenous Art from the Americas, Oceania, & Africa. Within their collection, there are a few items from Tamaya which include a water jar made by Eudora Montoya, a flared rim jar made by Rose Armijo, a Tamayame pot made in the mid-1800s, & a straw inlaid cross made by Elmer Leon.





The Coe Center had decided to gift the four Tamayame items back to the Pueblo, along with a dozen SW Indigenous reference books & a monetary donation to the THPO. New Mexico Wildlife Foundation



In attendance were the executive directors from National Wildlife Federation state affiliate offices from across the country, including Puerto Rico. In New Mexico, the state affiliate office is the New Mexico Wildlife Federation (NMWF), who has strongly supported the Pueblo's work on many occasions. The purpose of the meeting was to highlight some of the work the Pueblo has achieved over the years by working hand and hand with other tribes, federal and state agencies, and nongovernmental organizations. The message to attendees was to emphasize the importance of these partnerships in achieving meaningful landscape-scale wildlife management and habitat improvement outcomes, and that tribes in their own states can be key players in contributing to these efforts, if they choose.

We received a lot of positive feedback from attendees and appreciated NMWF for inviting the Pueblo to highlight its efforts to such an important group. We look forward to continuing our strong partnership with NMWF into the future, and hope that state directors seize the opportunity to work together with tribes in their own states.

AIR POLLUTION IS THE WORLD'S LARGEST SINGLE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH RISK, HEART DISEASE IS THE SECOND LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH IN SANDOVAL COUNTY

HOW DOES AIR POLLUTION AFFECT HEART HEALTH?

Tiny particles travel into the bloodstream They damage the inside walls of your blood vessels, causing them to become narrower and harder







If you already have heart disease, even shortterm exposure to air pollution increases your risk of heart attack and stroke.



Restricted movement of blood vessels can increase your blood pressure

Your blood is more likely to clot, which can lead to a heart attack or stroke





Normal electrical functioning of your heart is affected, which can cause abnormal heart rhythms

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO REDUCE YOUR RISK?



Walk or cycle instead of driving (but avoid busy roads)



Eat plenty of fruit and vegtables



Exercise regularly



Monitor air pollution levels



Avoid highly polluted areas



If you have an exisiting heart condition, talk to your doctor

accept and dispose of
hazardous waste while
mitigating the risks
associated with the
storage of such materials.



As a reminder, HHW includes materials commonly used by households that are poisonous, flammable, corrosive, or toxic. Materials that fall under this category should not be thrown in with the rest of the trash and should instead be brought to the special HHW shed.

Accepted Materials Include:

- ·Motor Oil
- Drain Cleaner
- ·Bleach

·Glue

- ·Paint
- ·Rechargeable Batteries

- **Pesticides**
- ·Grease
- ·Lead-Acid Car Batteries

- Anti-Freeze
- Solvents



S.A.P.D. CELEBRATES OFFICER'S TRAINING MILESTONE



The Santa Ana Police Department is proud to announce that Officer Gachupin, Class 18, has successfully completed the Indian Country Police Officer Training Program at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Artesia, NM. This graduation marks a significant milestone in her career and a personal achievement.

With her roots and tribal affiliations with the Jemez and Santa Ana Pueblos, Officer Gachupin has developed a strong sense of belonging, responsibility, and commitment to the community. During the summer of 2023, she interned with the Santa Ana Police Department while pursuing several degrees from UNM. This internship was pivotal in her journey toward becoming a law enforcement officer. In July 2024, after completing the competitive selection and hiring process, she received her official appointment as Cadet Officer to the Santa Ana Police Department, marking her hard work and determination.

Officer Gachupin's training at the Indian Country Police Officer Training Program (ICPOTP) was a comprehensive and intensive 14-week program designed to equip her with the necessary skills and knowledge to serve effectively in law enforcement, particularly within Native American communities. The program emphasized physical fitness, tactical training, defensive tactics, firearms training, and crisis intervention techniques, ensuring she was well-prepared to handle various situations safely and effectively. The graduation ceremony on January 28th celebrated her achievements and the culmination of her training.

Looking ahead, we are confident that Officer Gachupin will make significant contributions to public safety. In recognition of her accomplishments, we extend our heartfelt congratulations to Officer Gachupin. The SAPD is proud to have her as part of the team, and we eagerly anticipate the positive impact she will undoubtedly make in her role as a law enforcement officer.

TRIBAL COURT CORNER

 If you originally were scheduled to appear for court when receiving your traffic citation, but now are not able to attend or have changed your mind, there is a form you can sign admitting to the offense and agree to pay the penalty assessment instead of appearing for court.

Please contact the Court Clerk's Office and a clerk will provide this form to you. *This does not apply to charges that require a hearing to be resolved.*

 If you have a traffic hearing scheduled, and are not able to attend at the scheduled date and time, let us know! If you fail to appear without the court's knowledge, it could lead to a bench warrant being issued against you. If given advanced notice, the Clerk's Office can work with you to re-set the hearing.

• If you get a traffic citation, it's very important that your contact information (mailing address/phone numbers) are up to date on your Driver's License. If the Clerk's Office need to reset a hearing for any reason and our mail is returned, your citation could end up being a bench warrant for failure to appear.

TRIBAL COURT CORNER

- Traffic court cases are scheduled as a trailing docket. This means all the
 cases are set for the same time on the day of traffic court, and we handle
 the cases in order of who arrives on a first come, first served basis.
- The Court has a contract Public Defender who can provide legal advice and assistance with your case with no charge. You can speak with her during her office hours, call her, or arrive early to speak with her before your hearing. Her phone number is 505-463-0344.
- There are several attorneys who have permission to practice in our Contemporary Court. Many of them are associated with New Mexico Legal Aid Native American Program, and can potentially assist you with your legal case at no cost. An updated list of all attorneys permitted to practice in Santa Ana are available at the Court Clerks' offices.

IN THE TRIBAL ENROLLMENT DEPARTMENT, WE ARE CURRENTLY WORKING ON OBTAINING C.I.B.'S FOR THE NON-ENROLLED PARENTS. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE CALCULATE THE CORRECT BLOOD QUANTUM FOR OUR ENROLLED TRIBAL MEMBERS. IF YOU OR YOUR CHILD(REN) HAVE A PARENT FROM ANOTHER TRIBE, IT WOULD BE APPRECIATED IF YOU CAN SUBMIT A C.I.B. FOR THE NON-ENROLLED PARENT.

WE HAVE BEEN REACHING OUT TO ENROLLED TRIBAL MEMBERS THROUGH BIRTHDAY CARDS THAT WE ARE REQUESTING ORIGINAL BIRTH CERTIFICATES FOR YOUR FILES. IT IS A FELONY TO MAKE COPIES OF BIRTH CERTIFICATES. PLEASE CALL OR STOP IN TO FIND OUT IF YOU ARE ONE WHO HAS NOT RESPONDED TO OUR REQUEST.

STARTING IN THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2025, WE WILL BE INCLUDING A SMALL GIFT IN ONE RANDOMLY SELECTED BIRTHDAY CARD FOR EACH MONTH. SO, IF YOUR ADDRESS HAS CHANGED OR IF WE DON'T HAVE AN ADDRESS ON FILE, PLEASE STOP IN AT OUR OFFICES TO FILL OUT AN UPDATE FORM.


