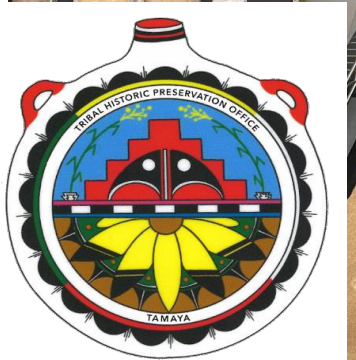
NEWS FROM THE THPO

ON DECEMBER 5TH, THREE MEMBERS OF THE TAMAYA POTTERY GROUP, DIANE, BRENDA, & MARTINA, THOMAS FROM THE THPO, & CULTURAL INVESTIGATORS WOODY & KHRISTIAN FLEW OUT TO SALT LAKE CITY. DURING THIS TRIP, OUR SMALL GROUP MET WITH THE UTAH BLM TO VIEW SOME GRINDING STONES HELD WITHIN THEIR CEREBUS COLLECTION.

A FEW YEARS AGO, THE TAMAYA POTTERY GROUP WAS RENEWED WITH ABOUT A DOZEN LADIES WITH MASEWII'S, EMMETT GARCIA, BLESSING TO LEARN & CONTINUE THE TRADITIONAL WAYS OF MAKING TAMAYAME POTTERY FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS. IN THEIR CLOSE WORK WITH OFFICER WOODY, THERE WAS A NEED IDENTIFIED, FOR GRINDING STONES FOR CLAYS AND OTHER MINERALS USED.

IN THPO'S PREVIOUS COLLABORATION WITH THE UTAH BLM, THEY INDICATED SPECIFIC MATERIALS MAYBE AVAILABLE FOR RETURN FOR USE IN TRADITIONAL OR CULTURAL PRACTICES. THE GROUNDSTONE REPRESENTED A UNIQUE INSTANCE, IN WHICH THE POTTERS COULD USE THESE ITEMS FOR BOTH TRADITIONAL POTTERY MAKING AND TEACHING THE NEXT GENERATIONS OF ASPIRING TAMAYAME POTTERS.

THE POTTERS WERE ABLE TO SHARE A BIT OF THE POTTERY MAKING PROCESS & THEIR JOURNEY & EFFORTS TO CONTINUE THE TAMAYAME POTTERY TRADITION. THE UTAH BLM WAS HIGHLY IMPRESSED & WANTS TO CONTINUE WORKING WITH TAMAYA IN THE FUTURE. AT THE END OF THE TRIP, 46 PIECES OF GROUNDSTONE (METATES, MANOS, MORTARS, & PESTLES) WERE ABLE TO COME BACK TO TAMAYA.

Santa Ana Potters Group

The Pueblo of Santa Ana potters' group, the Governor's Office, the Tribal Historic Preservation Office and the Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement collaborated with the Utah Bureau of Land Management State Director's Office, BLM archeologists and curators to acquire specific manos, metates, pestles and mortars for the Santa Ana potters group.

BLM Utah entered into a loan agreement to provide 46 of these items, which are designated a working collection, to the Pueblo of Santa Ana for traditional, cultural and educational practices to the potters group. BLM Utah will work with a collections advisory committee to convey permanently to the Pueblo of Santa Ana this working collection. The collection was transported to the Pueblo in early December.

POSITION REQUIREMENTS:

- MUST NOT HAVE ANY DUI/DWI CONVICTIONS WITHIN THE LAST FIVE YEARS FROM ANY TRIBAL, STATE, OR FEDERAL COURT
- MUST HAVE A VALID NEW MEXICO DRIVER'S LICENSE AND BE INSURABLE THROUGH THE TRIBE'S INSURANCE CARRIER.

PREFERENCE:

- TRIBAL MEMBER/NATIVE AMERICAN PREFERENCE SHALL APPLY TO ALL POSITIONS AT THE PUEBLO OF SANTA ANA
- PUEBLO OF SANTA ANA IS A DRUG/ALCOHOL FREE WORKPLACE
- ALL APPLICANTS MUST MEET THE MINIMUM REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE POSITION
- POSITIONS ARE CLOSED AFTER 2 WEEKS OR REMAIN OPEN UNTIL FILLED
